



MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

UNIVERSITY OF FORT HARE

AND

O.R.TAMBO DISTRICT MUNICIPALITY

20th May 2014

1. PREAMBLE

- 1.1 The ORTDM, as one of the six district municipalities within the Eastern Cape, is required to be a catalyst for development, an enabler of economic growth identified capacity and policy research needs towards meeting its development and an instrument for poverty alleviation. - 7.1 The agreement will remain in effect for the period of three years beginning from the 20th May 2014 to 19th April 2017.
