- 3. Submissions must be marked with the RFQ description and reference number, sealed and deposited in the tender box on or before the closing date and time for submissions.
- 4. Submissions deposited in the tender box after the closing time or closing date will be considered to be late.
- 5. Late submissions will not be accepted, and where practicable, shall be returned unopened to the bidder.
- O.R. Tambo District Municipality accepts no responsibility for ensuring that RFQ submissions are placed in the correct box, and submissions placed in the incorrect box will not be accepted.
- 7. Bidders are entitled to submit one quotation only, either as a single tendering entity or as a member of a joint venture or consortium.

SECTION 3: TEST FOR RESPONSIVENESS

Invalid submissions

Quotations shall be invalid if:

- The submission is not completed in non-erasable ink.
- 2. The bidder, if he or she is a natural person, is in the service of the state, or if not a natural person, a director, manager, principal shareholder of stakeholder of the bidder is in the service of the state.
- 3. The bidder is listed on the National Treasury Register of Tender Defaulters and / or List of Restricted Suppliers and is restricted from doing business with the public sector.
- 4. The bidder has been restricted from doing business with O.R. Tambo District Municipality in terms of its supply chain management policy and procedures.

Non-responsive submissions

Quotations will be declared as non-responsive and eliminated from further evaluation in the following instances:

- 1. The submission does not comply with the mandatory requirements of the RFQ, if any, including any minimum evaluation criteria.
- 2. The bidder's tax matters are found not to be in order upon verification by the Municipality on CSD, and the bidder fails to ensure that its tax matters are in order within such timeframe as may be granted by the municipality.
- 3. Where the bidder is not registered on CSD.
- 4. Where the bidder is not registered on the municipal supplier database, or does not meet the listing criteria for accredited suppliers specified in the municipality's SCM Policy, and does not register on the database or meet the listing criteria within such timeframe as may be granted by the municipality.

Evaluation of quotations

SECTION 5: SPECIFICATIONS AND EVALUATION CRITERIA

INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

Municipalities have constitutional obligation to provide safe drinking water to the communities they service. OR Tambo District Municipality (ORTDM) in the Eastern Cape has a mandate to provide safe water to it community. As mandated ORTDM has undertook a decision to implement Sikwayini Rural Water Supply (Spring Protection) for Sikwayini Village under Mhlontlo Local Municipality (MLM).

Sikwayini Community currently do not have access to clean potable water, as a result the community is subject to harmful water related diseases. ORTDM investigated the problem and a Spring Water Protection was proposed. Furthermore, water will be reticulated across the village for improved accessibility. The extent of additional services required for the Sikwayini Water Supply Borehole Scheme project includes a geotechnical investigation of the pipeline route.

PROJECT LOCATION

Sikwayini is a rural Village in the Mhlontlo Local Municipality (MLM), one of ORTDM's local municipalities. It is located about 60 km north of uMthatha. The locality of the project site are as follows:

SCOPE OF WORK

A detailed geotechnical investigation of the 1200-metre-long gravity main pipe to the storage reservoir and 13 054 metre pipeline route will form part of the scope of works. A layout plan is attached and shows the proposed route.



Investigations along the pipeline route shall comprise:

- 35 (No. by 400m centre to centre along the route of the pipeline), Hand Auger Holes of 75mm diameter to depths of 2,5m along the pipeline route for soil samples to indicate overall soils likely to be encountered. Samples from the Auger Holes shall be assessed for foundation indicator tests and compatibility to assist with the classification of the soils in terms of pipe bedding material.
- DCP testing at 300 metre intervals up to a maximum depth of 2 meters or refusal.
- Identification of borrow sites (min. 2 No.) for bedding material. These should include sites
 in the vicinity of the pipeline route. Includes sampling and testing of borrow material and
 analysis of results
- Detailed report with site conditions along pipeline route.

The guidelines and recommendations for the pipelines should cover excavatability, trench stability, pipe bedding and ground water.

The specification for bedding material is as follows:

- Bedding (selected granular and selected fill material) shall be fine sand or fine noncohesive soil, with maximum particle size of 5mm and shall not cake nor does form lump when drying.
- No sharp-edged stones shall be allowed to come into contact with pipes or fittings. A bedding material shall comply with the following requirements:

The material shall be free from organic matter and shall have a compatibility factor of not more than 0.4. The material should be classified as silty to fine sand having a stiffness ratio of not less than 5.0 MPa.



Deliverables

A preliminary report should be submitted within a week after the site investigation and should give an indication of the general founding conditions on site.

A detailed geotechnical report is required within four weeks after the site investigation and the service provider is to make recommendations with regard to the following:

- Investigation methods and results;
- General stability of the site;
- Founding conditions and foundation indicators;
- Safe bearing capacity recommendations at the relevant level below normal ground;
- Ground water seepage and possibility of occurrence of a perched water table;
- Material classification;
- Foundation system and depth recommendations; and
- The report must be submitted as three colour paper copy one electronic CD with files properly marked and ordered.

Programme of Work

Work shall commence within 5 working days after appointment. The Geotechnical Consultant shall indicate his required completion period. Weather conditions permitting, all field work and tests shall be completed, and draft report submitted within 4 weeks of the issue of the appointment.

The Quotation submitted must clearly indicate the following:

- Field Work Commencement Date
- Field Work Completion Date
- Date of the Delivery of Results and Report.

General

The service provider must confirm that the test pits and DCP's are clear from existing services. The geotechnical service provider will be solely responsible for rectifying any damage to any services.

a) Additional Geotechnical Investigations

Additional investigations during detailed design or construction stage may be required. A day rate must be provided for any additional survey work. This tariff must cover all costs, including



travelling even if it is necessary to go out into the field for an hour or two. All additional information must be submitted to the Engineer.

- 1.5 Failure on the part of a bidder to submit proof of B-BBEE Status level of contributor together with the bid, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for B-BBEE status level of contribution are not claimed.
- 1.6 The purchaser reserves the right to require of a bidder, either before a bid is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the purchaser.

2. **DEFINITIONS**

- (a) "B-BBEE" means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (b) "B-BBEE status level of contributor" means the B-BBEE status of an entity in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (c) "bid" means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of goods or services, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;
- (d) "Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act" means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);
- (e) "EME" means an Exempted Micro Enterprise in terms of a code of good practice on black economic



empowerment issued in terms of section 9 (1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;

- (f) "functionality" means the ability of a tenderer to provide goods or services in accordance with specifications as set out in the tender documents.
- (g) "prices" includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (h) "proof of B-BBEE status level of contributor" means:
 - 1) B-BBEE Status level certificate issued by an authorized body or person;
 - 2) A sworn affidavit as prescribed by the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice;
 - 3) Any other requirement prescribed in terms of the B-BBEE Act;
- "QSE" means a qualifying small business enterprise in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment issued in terms of section 9 (1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (j) "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;

- 1 This Municipal Bidding Document (MBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.
